A Word from Fr. Drummond


Laetare Sunday opens the fourth week of Lent. Laetare Sunday gets its name from the beginning of the Introit proper to that day: "Laetare Hierusalem et conventum facite omnes qui diligitis eam," or in English: "Rejoice with Jerusalem and be glad all who love her." This Sunday is marked by the use of Rose coloured vestments and even though it is still Lent, flowers are al-

lowed for decoration of the altar. Within the otherwise drab season of Lent, Laetare Sunday reminds us that the Lenten disciplines will soon give way to the joyful celebration of Easter.

Laetare Sunday helps to make the point that during the season of Lent we do not practice penance for the sake of penance: our Lenten disciplines and penances have a goal. And that goal is our spiritual purification and preparation for the proper celebration of Easter in which our salvation is made possible by the raising of Christ from the dead.

Thus this Sunday in the middle of the Lenten Season is a good time for us to stop and take stock of how successful we have been in our Lenten practices. Do we remember to observe abstinence on Fridays? How have we fared in our other Lenten practices, have we truly resisted those things we "gave up" or did we cheat, or even fail completely? If that is the case, this is the time to now redouble our efforts. We still have time for a fruitful Lent. If we have been successful in our Lenten disciplines we may try increasing them gradually. Fasting, almsgiving and prayer are the marks of the season but the first two will only be successful if covered by prayer. All our Lenten practices —as indeed all our spiritual practices throughout the year— have to begin and end in prayer.

The Stations of the Cross are a prayerful devotion that is particularly suitable to Lent. We need not wait until our public Friday Stations in order to pray them but can —and should also do them on our own. The Rosary is, of course, always appropriate and helpful as well. In addition, prayerful reading of Sacred Scripture can be very profitable —or just sitting in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament. However we do it, we need to always and continually intensify our prayer lives.
