OUR FATHER (THE LORD'S PRAYER)

Our Father Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name; Thy Kingdom come; Thy Will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

HAIL MARY

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

GRACE BEFORE MEALS

Bless us O Lord, and these Thy gifts which we are about to receive from Thy bounty, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

ACT OF CONTRITION

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee. I detest all my sins because I dread the loss of Heaven and the pains of hell. But most of all, because they offend Thee, my God, who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of Thy Grace to confess my sins, to do my penance, and to amend my life. Amen.

ST. MICHAEL PRAYER

St. Michael, the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

ACT OF FAITH

O my God! I firmly believe that Thou are one God in Three Divine Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; I believe that Thy Divine Son became man, and died for our sins, and that He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches, because Thou has revealed them, Who canst neither deceive nor be deceived. Amen.

ACT OF HOPE

O my God! Relying on Thine infinite goodness and promises, I hope to obtain pardon of my sins, the help of Thy grace, and life everlasting, through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord, and Redeemer. Amen.

O my God! I love Thee above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because Thou art all-good and worthy of all my love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of Thee. I forgive all who have injured me and I ask pardon of all whom I have injured. Amen.

STUDENTS SHOULD KNOW THE FOLLOWING:

HOW TO GENUFLECT

A genuflection is made by bending the right knee to the ground (while facing the Blessed Sacrament)

WHEN TO GENUFLECT

- We genuflect whenever we pass before the Blessed Sacrament. We genuflect when we enter or exit the pew at church because the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the tabernacle.
- We kneel on both knees when we enter the pew and the Blessed Sacrament is exposed (that is, it is visible to us) in the Monstrance for public adoration.

Note: We may also genuflect to the Holy Cross during the Good Friday Liturgy. Sometimes, when we recite the Creed (on the Annunciation and on Christmas) we genuflect at the words, "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

HOW TO MAKE THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

To make the Sign of the Cross, using the right hand, touch the forehead while saying, "In the Name of the Father," then touch the heart and say, "and of the Son," then touch the left then right front of the shoulders while saying, "and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." This prayer recalls the mystery of the Trinity and traces the Cross of Christ over the one who prays.
